<b>Eligibility Requirements</b>	<p>Students must be currently registered at a partner university and have completed a minimum of two years study at a high standard if they are completing a 4-year degree and a minimum of one year if completing a 3-year degree. A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.1 on a 4-point GPA scale or equivalent is generally required for all incoming students. <b>Ultimately, acceptance into a department is at the discretion of the departmental coordinator.</b></p> <p>If you have concerns or questions about how your student's academic standing will impact their application, please email <a href="mailto:erasmus.incoming@tcd.ie">erasmus.incoming@tcd.ie</a> or <a href="mailto:global.mobility@tcd.ie">global.mobility@tcd.ie</a>.</p> <p>Some areas of study have special minimum requirements - for the list, please see the Global Mobility Guide here: <a href="#">Trinity-Study-Abroad-Guide-2025-2026.pdf</a></p>

<b>Module (Class) Enrolment</b>	<p>Modules available for 25/26 can be found at <a href="#">Module Enrolment - Current Students - Trinity College Dublin (tcd.ie)</a> (list is subject to change)</p> <p>At Trinity, students are admitted to specific Disciplines (areas of study), rather than to the University as a whole. It is therefore important that students carry out your own research using the Module Directory linked above prior to submitting their application, to ensure that they are applying to their preferred areas of study. They will be assessed for admission to each of area of study and will only be eligible to enrol in modules within the areas you have applied to in their application.</p> <p>When choosing their host department in the application form, they must choose the department in which the inter-institutional agreement they were nominated under is held.</p> <p>Please note that <b>only undergraduate modules are available to visiting students</b> with some exceptions e.g., certain Law and Mathematics agreements allow for postgraduate students.</p>

	<p>Postgraduates are prohibited from enrolling in <a href="#">Trinity Electives</a>. Therefore, students who are not required to be registered as a postgraduate student are advised to register as an undergraduate student to apply.</p>
<b>ECTS Credit</b>	<p>Students typically take 30 ECTS per semester at Trinity and cannot exceed this amount. Modules usually have a 5 or 10ECTS value. Students must take a minimum of 20 ECTS in a semester and 45 ECTS for the academic year.</p>
<b>Host department</b>	<p>Students must take at least 50% of their ECTS per semester in their host department (as specified in the terms of the IIA and in the student's offer letter). Students can request to enrol in modules offered by other departments for the remaining ECTS.</p> <p>There are some exceptions to this rule. E.g., Languages</p>

<b>Visas and immigration</b>	<p>Students from some non-EU/EEA countries may require a visa to enter Ireland. <b>Insurance</b>	Students arriving from outside the EU/EEA, Switzerland and the UK should contact their health insurance provider to determine if they are covered while studying abroad. If not, students will need to arrange health insurance prior to departure, or purchase insurance locally in Ireland.  Health insurance cover is mandatory for those who are required to register with the Irish Naturalisation and Immigration Service (INIS).
