## APPLICATION PROCEDURE FOR INCOMING EXCHANGE STUDENTS

After the end of nominations period (15th May or 15th October), each nominated student will receive an email detailing the online application procedure, as well as detailed information regarding academic offer - if available.



Application deadline Semester 1: 15th June

Application deadline Semester 2: 15th November



### List of required documents

1. A recent ID photograph (in JPEG): compulsory to issue the Student Card
2. ID Card or passport (for European countries) or passport for non-European students
3. Updated transcripts of records in English (Spanish is accepted)
4. Language certificates or letter of a language teacher: there are two sections to fill in case you take courses in French and in English.
  - For students who want to take courses in French, please upload your score report or your letter of recommendation with a B2 Level in "Certificat de langue française niveau B2 (pour les non francophones)".
  - For students for whose English is not their native language, upload a letter of recommendation or a score report if you have one, stating also a B2 level, in "Certificat de langue anglaise niveau B2 (pour les non anglophones)"
5. Cover Letter
6. Curriculum Vitae
7. Translation of your birth certificate in French authenticated by an authorized institution (for non-European Students)
8. European Health Card (for Erasmus students)
9. Health Insurance Certificate valid for the period of stay in France (only for Students over 28 years old)

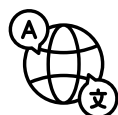

### Courses and Language of Instruction

**Once the academic offer is available and from May 15th (for Fall Semester) and October 15th (for Spring Semester), each student will receive the lists of courses by email.**

Students can attend courses in Licence (Bachelor's Degree – in 3 years) and in Master 1 (4th Year of studies) at the Faculty of Law in LILLE.

**Master 2 courses are not open to Exchange students.**

Courses are taught in French and in English in Licence Droit Européen and Master 1 Droit International et Européen).

The Learning Agreement and classes selection can be adjusted within a period of 3 weeks after the beginning of semesters.

- **For courses in Law taught in French:**

It is compulsory to have a **minimum B2 Level** to attend courses taught in French. We trust our partners to send students with relevant French level (a letter of recommendation of a French Lecturer is accepted).

- **For courses in Law taught in English:**

We require applicants to demonstrate **competence in the English language with a B2 level**, by providing one **official certificate** with scores dated less than two years.

If English is the student's native language, it is not necessary to provide a certificate. Students will need to **provide a valid passport from an English speaking country** during application.

If English is the student's language of instruction at their home institution, it is not necessary to provide a certificate. University **Coordinators must confirm** that English is the medium of instruction at their home institution and that their students consequently have the sufficient proficiency in English.



### French as a Foreign Language

Besides courses in Law, Erasmus and International Students will have the opportunity to attend a **French Course "Français Langue Etrangère (FLE)"** (24 hours/semester – course 2 hours a week on Thursday from 16.00 until 18.00 – 3 ECTS only if students attend all the courses). This course is free of charge.



### Orientation Days

- One Introductory Meeting before the courses start at the Faculty of Law (for Fall Semester by the end of August, for Spring Semester, in early January).
- One Welcome Session for all Université Catholique de Lille Incoming Students, will also take place at the beginning of each semester.



### VISA information

#### **During the nomination and application period (and before arrival in France):**

- **Visa exemption for students from the following countries:** Germany, Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Spain, France, Greece, Ireland, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Portugal, Sweden, Cyprus, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Czech Republic, Romania, Slovakia, Island, Liechtenstein, Norway, Andorra, Monaco, Switzerland, San Marino and the Vatican.
- **For students with the nationality of the following countries:** Angola, Algeria, Argentina, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bahrain, Benin, Bolivia, Brazil, Burkina Faso, Burma, Burundi, Cambodia, Cameroon, Canada, Central African Republic, Chad, Chile, China, Colombia, Comoros, Democratic Republic of Congo, Djibouti, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Egypt, Ethiopia, Gabon, Georgia, Ghana, Guinea, Haiti, Honk Kong, India, Indonesia, Iran, Israel, Ivory Coast, Japan, Jordan, Kenya, Kuwait, Lebanon, Madagascar, Malaysia, Mali, Mauritania, Mauritius, Mexico, Morocco, Nepal, Nigeria, Peru, Qatar, Republic of Congo, Russia, Rwanda, Saudi Arabia, Senegal, Singapore, South Africa, South Korea, Taiwan, Thailand, Togo, Tunisia, Turkey, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, United States, Vietnam.

## VISA information

> An online application procedure has been set up by the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs. This procedure is mandatory for obtaining a STUDENT VISA.

**For nominated students, we will give them precise information on this matter.**

- **For students from any other nationalities:** Students must check with the French Consulate which is the closest to their home. They will be explained the process and the list of required documents to get a visa.

- The time taken to obtain a visa may vary from one country to another. It is important to find out well in advance.
- A tourist visa is not sufficient: students will face being expelled from France after 3 months and any diplomas or credits obtained will not be recognized.
- Students coming without a student visa will not be accepted.
