Grading System

Examinations are graded according to a scale ranging from 0 to 30, with 18 as a minimum passing mark. A *cum laude* may be added to the highest grade (30 e lode), as a mention of special distinction. The minimum total passing mark is 66, whereas the maximum final university degree grade upon graduation is 110/110. For outstanding students degrees may be awarded *cum laude*.

Exchange Students

Students interested in an exchange period at UniTrento should first be selected by their home university, both fulfilling the requirements of the specific international programme and those of UniTrento study courses.

Admission to certain classes is not always guaranteed because there may be specific academic and linguistic requirements. Exchange students with Italian proficiency can attend classes taught in Italian. UniTrento also offers classes in various other foreign languages.

Chosen courses must be pre-approved by the home university and by UniTrento through a Learning Agreement that the exchange student has to draft before arrival.

Exchange Students Application Deadlines:

May 31st

for applications for the Fall semester (Sept-Dec)

October 31st

for applications for the Spring semester (Feb-Jun)



Degree Seeking Students

Students interested in earning a Bachelor's or Master's degree at UniTrento can choose among a wide variety of different areas. Admission to the degree programmes is selective and there are specific academic and language requirements for each one.

Interested candidates must submit a complete online application package typically **between December and March**, with an extended deadline for European Union (EU) students in **June**. Students living outside the EU also complete the online procedure on the Università website and then apply for a student visa at the Italian Embassy or Consulate in their home country.

Scholarships

Students admitted to Bachelor's or Master's degree programmes can be awarded a scholarship according to the following selection criteria:

- **Non-EU citizens living abroad:** admission score and academic performance. Top scored candidates will be entitled to receive a scholarship from UniTrento for the yearly amount of **€7.200** that can be confirmed for the following year(s) according to the student's academic performance (credits earned). Female non-EU citizens enrolling in a STEM area degree programme (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) can benefit from a scholarship of **€8.500** per year. Students who benefit from these scholarships will receive a tuition fee waiver. Detailed information is available online.
- **EU citizens and Non-EU citizens living in Italy:** financial situation and academic performance. After being admitted to the chosen degree programme, students can apply for Opera Universitaria scholarships awarded by the local University Guild, the amount for which is up to approximately **€7.000** per year according to each student's financial situation. Students who benefit from these scholarships can also be eligible to receive a tuition fee waiver. Detailed information is available online.

Degree seeking students in the frame of international mobility programmes (for instance: Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree, Double Degree) should refer to the requirements of the specific mobility programme.

Services and Facilities for International Students



Welcome Services

International students are supported by the International Mobility Offices when they need to deal with visa procedures, health insurance and general information on university life at UniTrento. Other welcome activities such as orientation weeks or guided visits may also be organised for international students.

Sustainable UniTrento

We are committed to promoting environmentally friendly practices in a wide range of areas throughout the university, including international mobility. UniTrento has adopted various initiatives to support and promote green practices on the part of students and staff in all incoming and outgoing mobility programmes to try to reduce the impact of travel on the environment. Italy for Beginners

A 30-hour optional seminar offers new-comers a wide overview on different aspects of Italian culture: from history to geography, from social to linguistic issues, from cinema to arts and literature. Participants get 6 credits.

Tandem Language Learning

An opportunity to improve skills in a foreign language outside the classroom in a more relaxed and informal context. Usually, it is a casual meeting between native speakers of different languages who wish to improve their level of proficiency in a foreign language by speaking together and learning about each other's cultures.

Tutor-Buddy Programme

The buddy programme is designed to help new students settle in to student life at UniTrento and offers informal and friendly support by current local students to all international students who request to participate.

Accommodation

Accommodation in Opera Universitaria housing on campus is not guaranteed to all international students and will be assigned according to availability and each student's profile.

Maximum cost per student for on-campus housing:

330 euro/month in a shared double room

390 euro/month in a single room

University Restaurants

International students receive a University card to access the 5 University canteens in Trento. Students in Rovereto may access certain restaurants at discounted rates.



Borrow a Bike

Through the bike loan service students who live on campus have access to bicycles according to availability.

Bus Pass

Degree seeking and exchange students can buy a pass for 50 euros per academic year and with it can use all trains and buses (urban and extra-urban) for free throughout the entire Province of Trentino.

UniTrento Sport

Members can sign up for a variety of fitness classes and have free access to University sports facilities; discounts on town sports centres, swimming-pools, ski-lifts and the possibility to participate in competitions and sports events.

University Library System

Access to university libraries and to the majority of library services is free and open to all students. The University Library System includes a Central Library, which was designed by the Renzo Piano Building Workshop and opened in 2016.

IT Services

Students enrolled at UniTrento have open access to IT services: computer rooms, online networks and services.



Language Centre

On Campus Jobs

Students enrolled at UniTrento have the opportunity to carry out paid part-time working activities at the University.

Counselling

A linguistic and intercultural mediation service is available to help students with any relational issues. Moreover, a psychological service is available to support students in case of any difficulties during their stay in Trento.

Job Guidance

The Job Guidance Service of UniTrento organizes on a regular basis seminars with companies, on-campus interviews with recruiters, career days, individual coaching sessions and placement days. It also offers personal guidance for a successful career after graduation and it promotes and activates internships in public and private companies.

Services for Disability Inclusion

Students with a disability or special needs are entitled to a dedicated assistance service. According to their needs, students are provided with technical and educational tools and receive personalized support. In addition to practical assistance, economic accommodation facilities are also available.
